I am sending this email to voice my concerns regarding the handling, by the parish council, of the recent LBHP planning application 24/0414/MFUL. I would be grateful if you could share this with PC at or before the meeting on 3rd June.

I was a member of the neighbourhood planning team, the aim of any neighbourhood plan is to give communities an opportunity to have a say in the future of the places where they live. It provides a plan with real legal weight that should direct development in the local area. Hundreds, if not thousands, of hours were given by the NP team to gather and publish the thoughts of parishioners over a 4 year period at the direction and on behalf of the Parish Council. It is in effect the Parish Councils Plan. The process was complicated and Dee Woods, also a member of the NP team, with a wealth of experience in planning, volunteered to advise the council in regard to future planning applications and compliance with the NP. The PC was provided with a robust document from Ms Woods outlining a number of areas where the application in question did not comply with the plan. This document appears to have been ignored. The NP in its current form, is valid until 2031.

The notes from the meeting in the village hall with residents confirms, without any doubt, that the views of parishioners remain unchanged. However, the PC chose to support the LBHP proposal, after one short meeting with one member of staff at LBHP, without reflecting, in any way, the concerns expressed at the village meeting.

The application has been designated as a major development by East Devon planning department and in my view, could be considered a major deviation from the Neighbourhood plan. Are the PC aware that the government neighbourhood planning process was amended on 9/5/2019 and states that "Material modifications which do change the nature of the plan or order would require examination and a referendum. This might, for example, involve allocating significant new sites for development." I know from my own experience that t\*his would be a significant and time consuming

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piece of work for the PC to undertake.\*

My understanding is that the role of a Parish Council is to act on behalf of the communities they represent. One of the most important roles being to give views, on behalf of the community, on planning applications that affect the parish. Although I genuinely appreciate all of the voluntary work that the PC put in on behalf of the community; on this occasion I do not believe the PC acted on behalf of their parishioners and as such should be held to account.

I would be grateful if you would report my comments as a local resident of Otterton to the Parish Councillors at their meeting on 3 June 2024. I was surprised and disappointed to learn of the Parish Councillors decision to support the current planning application at Ladram Bay. I understand that the vote was 5 in favour and one against.

The communities views about the application were well represented at the public meeting on 24 May, when it was obvious that the majority of residents present strongly objected to the application, and the further expansion of the site. I would like to see the recorded notes of this meeting.

In addition the Parish Council's Neighbourhood Plan policy, specific to development at Ladram Bay Holiday Park, limits further development outside the red line/agreed development boundary of the site. This Neighbourhood Plan was made, following the successful referendum on 6 May 2021, where 92% of residents who voted were in favour of the Plan. It seems very contrary that the Councillors should go against their own planning policy.

I refer to what Parish Councillors do, published on East Devon District Council's website :

\*"As a Councillor you will need to :\*

\*Listen and be a voice for your community: the single most important task is to listen to the views of the people in their community. By doing this, Councillors gain important information about the concerns and aspirations of the people they represent. It is for this reason that many public bodies turn to the Parish or Town Council for information about the services they provide. For example, the District Council consults the local councils on planning applications which affect their area. Local councils act as a voice for their communities, responding to other authorities and drawing attention to issues which concern the community."\*

I feel that the five Parish Councillors have completely failed to carry out this duty or to act as the voice for this community in this matter. Yours sincerely\*
